Annually the Florida Junior Chamber selects and recognizes Florida's Outstanding Individuals based upon several bases of criteria. Each honoree shall be awarded a distinguished trophy and certificate of achievement. This awards ceremony dramatizes each winner's career in narrative form and provides a stage for the honorees to challenge and inspire Florida's youth.

Young men and women of all fields of endeavor may be nominated as an Outstanding Young Floridian. One or more nominations may be submitted by an individual, organizations, associations, institution or any Junior Chamber chapter. Winners will be selected by a panel of judges and the winners will be notified prior to the ceremony. Outstanding Young Floridian Honorees will be selected on the basis of achievement or contribution in any of three (3) of the following areas:

- 1. Personal Improvement or accomplishment
- 2. Financial success and economic innovation
- 3. Social improvement to major contemporary problems
- 4. Philanthropic contribution or voluntary service
- 5. Politics or government service
- 6. Scientific or technological contributions
- 7. Legal reform
- 8. Cultural achievement (to include contributions in literature, history, education or the arts)
- 9. Academic leadership or accomplishment
- 10. Moral and religious leadership
- 11. Athletic accomplishment
- 12. Success in the influence of public opinion (news media and other means)
- 13. Any other important contributions to community, state, or nation, at the discretion of the judges

Also in determining the recipients of this recognition, the judges shall give particular consideration to each nominee's record of adherence to the principles embodied in the Jaycee Creed:

We Believe:

That Faith in God brings meaning and purpose to human life;
That the brotherhood of man transcends the sovereignty of nations;
That economic justice can best be won by free men through free enterprise;
That government should be of laws rather than of men;
That Earth's great treasure lies in the human personality;
And that service to humanity is the best work of life!





AWARD CATEGORIES

The following 12 awards are considered as the Florida Jaycees Outstanding Floridian program. The categories are used to highlight that person who is an Outstanding Floridian in a specific area. Each winner MUST be between the ages of 18 - 40 (inclusive) except the Hillary McCabe Outstanding Student Award, Outstanding Floridian and Pioneer. You are encouraged to submit multiple nominees in each category, but each nominee must be able to attend the ceremony to be considered.

OUTSTANDING FLORIDIAN -- The Outstanding Floridian awards are given to a maximum of three people who, because of overall extraordinary talent and initiative, have made important contributions to the general welfare of the community, state or nation, and to their chosen field or profession. The nominees must be U.S. citizens or apply for citizenship by January 1st of the previous year and must be residents of the state of Florida. These awards are sponsored by the Florida JCI Senate.

OUTSTANDING YOUNG RELIGIOUS LEADER (OYRL)--The Outstanding Young Religious Leader Award recognizes the outstanding young man or woman who has given the most effective evidence during the year of his or her faith in God through church work or other community activities. Nominees must be between the ages of 18 and 40, and shall not be ordained or professionally involved in religious work.

J.L. MCMULLEN AWARD (GOOD GOVERNMENT AWARD)—The Good Government Award recognizes one citizen in Florida who has contributed the most to good government during the past year by his or her work activities that go beyond the scope of one's normal responsibilities. Nominees must be between the ages of 18 and 40, who may or may not be office holders and they need not be residents of the submitting chapter's local area. The winner will be that Florida citizen who has done the most to foster good government during the past year.

OUTSTANDING YOUNG FARMER AWARD--This award recognizes the outstanding young farmer between the ages of 18 and 40 in the state of Florida. The purpose of this award is to foster better urban-rural relations through Jaycee/farmer contacts and by creating a greater public interest in and understanding of today's farmer and their problems. Local chapters are urged to recognize promising young farmers in their community with the local OYF award and then submit the winner for Florida OYF award. The Florida winner, in turn, may be submitted for national competition.





RALPH M. WILLIAMS, JR. MEMORIAL AWARD (OUTSTANDING YOUNG EDUCATOR AWARD)--Ralph M Williams Jr. was the first black Florida Jaycee. He was a member of the Merritt Island Jaycees and served his community with excellence. Mr. Williams received the Outstanding Young Educator Award in 1965. He served his local school as a classroom teacher, administrator and finally as an area superintendent totaling 35 years of unwavering service to education. The Ralph M. Williams, Jr. Memorial Award program seeks to find the young man or woman between the ages of 18 and 40 who has made the greatest contribution to the teaching or education profession or is the most effective classroom teacher in the state of Florida.

ARTHUR KAIL MEMORIAL AWARD (OUTSTANDING YOUNG FIREFIGHTER/EMT)--This award honors the Outstanding Young Fire Fighter, Paramedic or Emergency Technician between the ages of 18 and 40 in the state of Florida. This award is designed to honor an individual in this profession who has dedicated their lives to the service of mankind. It is given in memory of Arthur Kail, a dedicated past president of the Hollywood Jaycees, who was instrumental to the development of that chapter up until his death at age 40.

GENERAL "CHAPPIE" JAMES MEMORIAL AWARD (OUTSTANDING AMERICAN) --The General "Chappie" James Memorial Award was previously known as Florida's Outstanding American Award and it is presented to the one Florida citizen, between the ages of 18 and 40, who has been a particular outstanding example of the traditions and ideals which have made our country great. The winner will have provided a splendid personal example of patriotic spirit and by his or her activities will have encouraged others to revere our American traditions and to practice its highest principles. This award is named in memory of Daniel "Chappie" James, the first black Four-Star General in U.S. military history. His distinguished career included being an ace combat pilot, flying 101 combat missions in the Korean War and appointments as Deputy Secretary of Defense, Vice Commander of the U.S. Air Force's Military Airlift Command and Commander-in-Chief of the North American Air Defense Command. He was well known for his speeches on Americanism and patriotism, being called "an eloquent spokesman for the American Dream we so rarely achieve," and for his concern regarding the future of the young people of our nation. General James was an active member of the Pensacola Jaycees until his death in 1978.

COL WILLIAM CARR MEMORIAL AWARD (ENTREPRENEUR OF THE YEAR)—The Entrepreneur of the Year Award, started by the North Miami Beach Jaycees, is in memory of the late USAF Col. William Carr. Carr, a longtime North Dade resident and city councilman, served as a living example of commitment to the community. He fully recognized the value civic-minded organizations, like the Jaycees, could have in the community and actively sought their participation in the municipal process. This award is presented to a merchant or professional between the ages of 18 and 40, in recognition of his or her commitment to the community.





HILLARY MCCABE MEMORIAL AWARD (OUTSTANDING LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT) -- The Hillary McCabe Memorial Award, started by the Miami Lakes Jaycees, will be awarded annually to a high school student who demonstrates extraordinary character and commitment to the community. This award is named in memory of Hillary McCabe, a young Miami Lakes resident who fought admirably to remain one step ahead of cancer. Her resilience, perseverance and relentless spirit were a testimony to be promised the youth in the community hold.

OUTSTANDING YOUNG ENVIRONMENTALIST AWARD--This award recognizes the young man or woman from the state of Florida who, through his or her profession or volunteer work, have improved the general awareness of the need for environmental care and concern. Nominees must be between the ages of 18 and 40.

COOPER-TAYLOR-MOON MEMORIAL AWARD (PUBLIC SAFETY/LAW ENFORCEMENT)--The Cooper-Taylor-Moon Memorial Award is presented to that Florida citizen who has done the most to promote safety. "Safety" includes any area of human activity, and is not restricted to highway safety. Nominees must be between the ages of 18 and 40. The award is named in memory of two Gainesville Jaycees, George Cooper and Bob Taylor, who died in an accident while driving to the 1953 Jaycee Summer Conference. James H. Moon was a Florida Jaycee and Jacksonville policemen who was killed in the line of duty on September 27, 1971.

PIONEER AWARDS--The Pioneer Awards are given to a maximum of three people who, because of overall extraordinary talent and initiative, have made important contributions to the general welfare of the community, state or nation, and to their chosen field or profession.

RULES

- 1. All nominees must be between the ages to 18 40 at time of submission. This restrictions DOES NOT apply to the "Hillary McCabe Memorial Award (Outstanding Local High School Student)" and the "Pioneer Awards".
- 2. Nominees must be a US Citizen (native born or naturalized) or must have applied for citizenship prior to January 1st of this year.
- 3. The nominee must sign the nomination form personally. The signature will attest to all facts contained on the form; give permission for publication of the facts; and indicate willingness, barring extreme circumstances, to attend the Outstanding Young Floridians awards ceremony, in its entirety, if the nominee is to be under consideration for the Outstanding Young Floridians award.
- 4. All information must be included with this form.
- 5. At least 5-10 photos pertinent to nomination. (Community service related, work related, family related, etc.) At least one (1) high-resolution color head and shoulder photo is required (digital preferred).
- 6. Digital and mailed submissions are permitted.
- 7. All entries must be postmarked (if mailed) or received (if emailed) no later July 1, 2016 for use in ceremony, along with a \$10 entry fee and submitted to:
